

## **Principles of the ethical behavior**

### **Fabrication and falsification**

Authors of submitted manuscripts or published articles that fabricate or falsify results, including manipulation of images, may be subject to sanctions and published articles may be retracted.

### **Plagiarism**

Copying at least one sentence from someone else's manuscript or even one of your own, previously published, without proper citation is considered plagiarism. Authors must not use the words, figures, or ideas of others without attribution. All sources should be cited where they are used. The Journal's editorial board uses [StrikePlagiarism.com](http://StrikePlagiarism.com) to identify materials that match published and submitted manuscripts. Manuscripts that plagiarize those of other authors, whether published or unpublished, will be rejected and authors may be subject to sanctions. Any published articles may need to be corrected or retracted.

### **Submitting an article to several publishing houses at the same time**

The journal «Philological Treatises» publishes articles that have not been published before and have not been submitted for publication to any other publishing house, containing original results of experimental and theoretical research in the field of philology and translation studies.

### **Manipulating quotes**

Authors whose submitted manuscripts contain citations whose primary purpose is to increase the number of citations to a particular author's work or articles published in a particular journal may be subject to sanctions. Editors and reviewers should not ask authors to include references for the sole purpose of increasing citations to their own or a partner's work, or to a journal or other publication with which they are affiliated.

### **Credits and Acknowledgments**

All listed authors must have made a significant scientific contribution to the research of the manuscript and agree with the scientific results presented. It is important to list all those who have made significant scientific contributions. Anyone who contributed to the research or preparation of the manuscript but is not an author should be credited in the Acknowledgments section at the end of the article.
